## ON-SITE CONFERENCE IN ATHENS, GREECE

Representing approximately 12% of GDP in Greece, public procurement is a critical pillar of public service delivery. It is also the government activity most vulnerable to waste, mismanagement and corruption.

The project "Enhancing transparency and integrity in the public procurement system through an integrated risk management system", funded by the European Union via the Technical Support Instrument and implemented by the OECD in cooperation with the European Commission aims at supporting Greece in its efforts to implement reforms, which could encourage investment, increase competitiveness, and assist in achieving sustainable economic and social convergence, resilience and recovery.

The project implementation is led by the National Transparency Agency (NTA) with the valuable involvement of HSPPA (Hellenic Single Public Procurement Authority) and the GSC (General Secretariat of Commerce)

An international conference will be organised to help disseminate all outputs of the project and to discuss the project outcomes and expected impact and how the different outputs will enhance the public procurement system and public spending from different angles including integrity and accountability. Furthermore, the implementation of an efficient framework to identify and mitigate risks in public procurement is particularly relevant given the large number of tenders and contracts within the framework of the European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF) and Greece's Recovery and resilience Plan (RRP)

There will be interactive panel sessions exploring risk management in public procurement, code of conducts for the public procurement workforce and public procurement auditing methodologies. Featuring expert speakers from Greek stakeholders and international peers, these discussions will offer valuable insights into key challenges and good practices for each topic. Each session will include an interactive Q&A, encouraging dynamic engagement between speakers and the audience.

	Risks affecting public procurement can have significant consequences on the quality and quantity of public services governments can provide. Given its scale and financia impact, public procurement in Greece faces distinct challenges, including risks related to efficiency, transparency, and accountability. The adoption of law 5013/2013 enabled significant advancement in the area of risk management with the establishment of the standard Risk Management Policy and Framework. A key objective of the project was the adaptation of the standard Policy and Framework to public procurement.
	This session aims at discussing the relevance of risk management in public procurement and the risk framework developed under this project and at discussing planned outcomes.
	The OECD will present the Public Procurement Risk Management Framework and comprehensive risk registry developed under the project and the planned use and dissemination of these tools among practitioners to improve their capabilities and contribute to the overall efforts of professionalising the procurement function in Greece (15 minutes). The panel discussion with Greek stakeholders and an international peer will then focus on the expected outcomes and impact of the Public Procurement Risk Framework and comprehensive risk registry (30 minutes).
